I have recently finished a PhD at BITS' Goa Campus under the supervision of Dr. Nilak Datta. My area of interest is the Indian Graphic Novel; I am tracing its literary lineage to the American Graphic Novel of the 1970s and the anti-comics movement that swept across the US during the late 1940s and early 1950s. I am also interested in issues of production, circulation, and reception of the genre within India, the last of which has led to interesting ethnographic fieldwork at comic conventions in Delhi and Mumbai.

The Quint is a digital media platform, founded by Raghav Bahl and Ritu Kapur.
